

Customs formalities, goods transport Poland

For the driver, the following documents are required:

- passport or identity card;
- national or international driving licence;
- tachograph disks or individual control book;
- ADR certificate (for dangerous goods transport);
- if the vehicle is registered in a country other than Poland (EU or non EU country) and the driver is not mentioned in the registration document as the owner of the vehicle, he must be in possession of a document certifying his right to drive the vehicle e.g. an authorisation written by the owner of the vehicle, the contract of loan or any other document stating that the driver has the right to drive the vehicle. No specific form is required, however. It is advised to have this document translated into Polish or into another commonly used language such as English, German or Russian.

For the vehicle, the following documents are required:

- registration certificate;
- green international insurance card for vehicles registered in countries other than the EU member states, Norway or Switzerland;
- valid authorisation as required according to bilateral or multilateral agreements;
- documents required under the ADR and ATP agreements, as necessary;
- proof of payment of the road user charge.

For the goods, the following documents are required:

- CMR consignment note;
- TIR carnet or Community transit document;
- ATA carnet, as necessary.
