

Tolls / road use charge, goods transport Poland

Road use charge (from 01.07.11)

As of 1 July 2011, a new electronic toll system called viaTOLL will be implemented in Poland. All goods vehicles over 3.5t will have to pay the tolls. Vehicles will therefore have to be equipped with On Board Units (OBU). Calculation of tolls will depend on the number of kms travelled, the road category (motorway, expressway, national road), the vehicle maximum permissible weight and the EURO category.

The new system will apply on selected road sections which are indicated as A (motorways), AS (expressways), GP and G (national roads). These roads and road sections are [here](#).

Toll rates from 01.07.2011 will be as follows (in PLN):

A and AS roads

	≤ Euro II	Euro III	Euro IV	≥ EuroV
Trucks >3.5t – <12t	0.40	0.35	0.28	0.20
Trucks ≥12t	0.53	0.46	0.37	0.27

GP and G roads

	≤ Euro II	Euro III	Euro IV	≥ EuroV
Trucks >3.5t – <12t	0.32	0.28	0.22	0.16
Trucks ≥12t	0.42	0.37	0.29	0.21

In order to register in the system and create a viaTOLL user account, you need to prepare several documents which are listed on the following [webpage](#). Registration has been possible since 2 May 2011. All companies can register directly on the following [website](#). A toll calculator is also available [here](#).

After 1 July 2011, old vignettes will not be valid. A monthly vignette can be bought up until 31 May, a weekly vignette up until 23 June and a daily vignette up until 29 June 2011.

Independent from the above, all vehicles are subject to tolls on the following motorways (rates in PLN are available on the websites below):

These motorways are managed by private companies and, therefore, the OBUs will not function on these roads. Tolls should be paid at special toll gates.
