

## Road Use Charge, Goods Transport Slovakia

Since 1 January 2010, vehicles with a MPW over 3.5t no longer have to buy a vignette to drive on specific sections of motorways, expressways and first-class roads in Slovakia. Instead, a new electronic tolling system has come into force where the final toll rate is calculated according to the vehicle's weight, number of axles and type of engine.

All vehicles using specific sections of the roads mentioned above, must be equipped with an On Board Unit (OBU). The OBU allows the satellite system to monitor the position of the vehicle and to calculate the number of kilometres driven on toll roads. The OBU may be ordered through Cesmad Slovakia.
