As you all know, road transport has played an increasingly central role in the efficiency of globalised supply chains. By serving international trade, road transport drives economic development and prosperity.

To ensure that road transport can more efficiently drive trade, non physical, administrative barriers must be removed at borders and I am confident that this conference will help us collectively identify how to harmonise, streamline and optimise procedures at borders, more specifically by the full implementation of the UN Harmonization and TIR Conventions.

In this regard, all governments must imperatively fully respect international law and the treaties which they have duly signed.

This particularly applies to the TIR Convention and to those who believe that they can turn a blind eye to international law, let alone to their national and regional laws. The IRU and its Members are not against fair competition with any other transit system, but road transport operators must be able to decide on what transit system to use.

In this respect, Ukraine has always been an example as regards the successful implementation of the TIR System, thanks to a very efficient public-private partnership between Ukrainian authorities, notably the Customs Authorities, the Ministry of Infrastructure and ASMAP Ukraine.

Indeed, Ukraine has, for many years, been one of the biggest beneficiaries of the TIR System worldwide with up to 500,000 TIR operations effectively started or terminated yearly, in full security, on Ukrainian territory.

Ukraine has also provided many innovative ideas which have paved the way for significant improvements to the TIR System, not only at national level, for example through the efficient computerisation of the system and the implementation of TIR-EPD and Real-Time SafeTIR, but also on at global level by proposing concrete improvements to the TIR Convention within the UN TIR bodies.

The IRU very much appreciates the constant constructive involvement of Ukrainian delegates within these UN bodies, such as at the meetings of the Working Party 30 or the TIR Executive Board and trusts that this will continue to benefit the TIR System as a whole long into the future to make it even more efficient and competitive through new products.

Generally speaking, being competitive and successful in any business means always keeping pace with innovations in the industry and ensuring high professional standards through professional training.

As such, the IRU Academy, with the elaboration recently of new programmes on crash prevention and secure loading, provides a great opportunity to enhance the safety and security of road transport operations.

ASMAP Ukraine is exemplary in its contribution to improve road safety and transport efficiency through its training arm, TCC-AIRCU, an exemplary IRU Academy Accredited Training Institute (ATI).

In June 2014, TCC-AIRCU was among the top 3 IRU Academy ATIs for their excellent contributions and tireless efforts in driving learning and development initiatives to build the required leadership and competencies to support a sustainable, safe and efficient road transport industry.

During this conference, we will also honour the winners of the IRU International Contest "Best Eurasian International Road Transport Operator".

I know that it is not easy to win this contest. In fact, road transport and, in particular, international road transport has become the most regulated mode of transport. Hence, establishing and managing a successful road transport company is becoming increasingly difficult due to the multitude of regulations with which all transport companies need to comply regarding their trucks, drivers, road traffic, loads and customs.

Therefore, I will be delighted to see the winners of the contest on this podium.

In conclusion, it is only by joining our efforts that we will be able to achieve our common economic, social and environmental goals. No challenge will be too great to overcome if we apply the IRU motto "working together for a better future".
