WTO TRADE FACILITATION AGREEMENT

Art. 1: Publication and availability of information

Art. 5: Other measures to enhance impartiality, non-discrimination and transparency

Art. 7: Clearance of goods

Art. 8: Border agency cooperation

Art. 9: Movement of goods intended for import under customs control

Art. 10: Formalities connected with importation, exportation and transit

Art. 11: Freedom of transit

Art. 12: Customs cooperation





Trade, customs and transport authorities must work together to promote border crossing facilitation.

United Nations agreements, such as the TIR Convention and the Harmonization Convention, provide for the practical implementation of the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement.
