




Truck Driver Turnover Rates by Carrier Type




The driver shortage is primarily an over-the-road for-hire truckload issue. So how many drivers are in that space?

Based on government data, ATA estimates that there are roughly 500,000 -600,000 OTR forhire TL drivers.




Driver Shortage







Causes of the Driver Shortage

- Regulations that reduce productivity





WHAT CAN BE DONE?

- Drivers between 18 and 21 years old
- Shippers/receivers need to treat drivers better
- Improve driver efficiency/driving time Reduce driver waiting times to increase driver miles
 - 8,500/month to 9,000 = 5.9%
 - 8,500/month to 9,500 = 11.8%
- More female drivers
